SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 565,
L.D. 1609, Bill, "An Act To Support Maine's Employers and Encourage Employers To
Hire Young Workers"

Amend the amendment in the first indented paragraph (page 1, line 11 in amendment)
by striking out the following: "and 8"

Amend the amendment after the first indented paragraph by inserting the following:

'Amend the bill in section 8 in §664 in the first line (page 2, line 34 in L.D.) by
striking out the following: "sub-§§1-A and 1-B are" and inserting the following: 'sub-§1-
A is'

Amend the bill in section 8 in §664 in subsection 1-A in the last line (page 2, line 39
in L.D.) by striking out the following: "20" and inserting the following: '18'

Amend the bill in section 8 in §664 by striking out all of subsection 1-B (page 2, lines
40 to 42 and page 3, lines 1 and 2 in L.D.)'

SUMMARY

This amendment retains the provision of the bill that provides for a training wage and
provides that a training wage may be paid to an employee who has not attained 18 years
of age, rather than 20 years of age as provided in the bill.
