- 1 **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
- Whereas, while the Maine Medical Use of Marijuana Act prohibits the location of medical marijuana dispensaries within 500 feet of a school, there are no such prohibitions placed on primary caregivers who cultivate medical marijuana for qualifying patients; and
- Whereas, without restrictions, the current law could be construed to permit a
 number of caregivers to be located in the same facility, each cultivating up to 6 marijuana
 plants; and
- 10 Whereas, the location of such a facility close to a school may pose a risk to minors 11 passing that facility on their way to and from school, which is a risk that needs to be 12 addressed as soon as possible; and
- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
- 17 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 18 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2423-A, sub-§13 is enacted to read:

19 <u>13. Ordinance restricting location of medical marijuana caregivers.</u> 20 Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter or any other provision of law to the 21 contrary, a municipality may adopt and enforce an ordinance that prohibits the location of 22 a primary caregiver, or that restricts the number of primary caregivers, within 500 feet of 23 the property line of a preexisting public or private school.

- Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this
 legislation takes effect when approved.

This bill amends the Maine Medical Use of Marijuana Act to allow a municipality to adopt an ordinance that prohibits the location of primary caregivers within 500 feet of the property line of a preexisting school.
