It also requires the Public Utilities Commission, Emergency Services Communication Bureau to use up to \$1,000,000 from the statewide E-9-1-1 surcharge and the statewide prepaid wireless telecommunications service E-9-1-1 surcharge to provide grants to support the consolidation of dispatch centers into existing public safety answering points. It requires the Emergency Services Communication Bureau to adopt routine technical rules to establish the application process and allowable uses for grants.

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill will reduce the statewide E-9-1-1 surcharge and the prepaid wireless E-9-1-1 surcharge from 45¢ per line to 40¢ per line. This change would result in a reduction of \$722,213 in Other Special Revenue Funds revenue for the Public Utilities Commission, starting in fiscal year 2018-19. The bill also includes a one-time allocation of \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2018-19 for grants to encourage the consolidation of dispatch centers.
