1 Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 3 Whereas, there are unused school facilities at the Maine Educational Center for the 4 Deaf and Hard of Hearing and the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf on Mackworth 5 Island; and 6 Whereas, the Legislature finds that it would serve a public purpose to lease these 7 unused school facilities to the protection and advocacy agency for persons with 8 disabilities designated by the Governor, which provides services for deaf and hard-of-hearing adults and children and other citizens of the State with disabilities; and 10 Whereas, this legislation authorizes the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to enter into agreements to lease these unused school facilities consistent with 11 12 state law regarding excess state property; and 13 Whereas, this legislation needs to take effect in time to allow for the lease of the unused school facilities by May 1, 2018; and 14 15 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within 16 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 17 18 therefore, 19 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 20 **Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §7407, sub-§12-B** is enacted to read: 21 12-B. Lease of school property to State's protection and advocacy agency. The 22 Department of Administrative and Financial Services may enter into lease agreements in 23 accordance with state law and policy on the lease of state-owned facilities, including but 24 not limited to the provisions of Title 5, chapter 154, to lease school property to the 25 protection and advocacy agency for persons with disabilities designated pursuant to Title 26 5, section 19502. Any funds received pursuant to this subsection must first be applied in 27 accordance with Title 5, section 1784. Any excess revenue above the requirements of Title 5, section 1784 may be retained by the school to be applied to statutorily authorized 28 29 programs. 30 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved. 31 **SUMMARY** 32 33 This bill allows the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to enter into 34 lease agreements to lease school property at the Maine Educational Center for the Deaf 35 and Hard of Hearing and the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf on Mackworth Island

to the State's protection and advocacy agency for persons with disabilities.
