1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §4004, sub-§1, ¶E, as amended by PL 2007, c. 586, §3, is
 further amended to read:

- E. Establishing a child death and serious injury review panel for reviewing deaths and serious injuries to children. The panel consists of the following members: the Chief Medical Examiner, a pediatrician, a public health nurse, forensic and community mental health clinicians, law enforcement officers, departmental child welfare staff, district attorneys and criminal or civil assistant attorneys general.
- 9 The purpose of the panel is to recommend to state and local agencies methods of 10 improving the child protection system, including modifications of statutes, rules, 11 policies and procedures; and

SUMMARY

This bill authorizes the Department of Health and Human Services to access public and confidential criminal history record information to assist in preventing child abuse and neglect.
