- Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
- Whereas, this legislation must take effect in time for Easter Sunday, April 21, 2019; and
- Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §3204, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 2003, c. 452, Pt. I, §55 and affected by Pt. X, §2, is amended to read:
- **2. Exceptions.** This section does not apply to:
- 13 A. Common, contract and private carriers;
- 14 B. Taxicabs;

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- 15 C. Airplanes;
- D. Newspapers;
- 17 E. Radio and television stations;
- F. Hotels, motels, rooming houses, tourist and trailer camps;
- 19 G. Restaurants:
- 20 H. Garages and motor vehicle service stations;
- I. Retail monument dealers;
- J. Automatic laundries;
- 23 K. Machines that vend anything of value, including, but not limited to, a product, 24 money or service;
- L. A satellite facility approved by the Superintendent of Financial Institutions under Title 9-B; or comparable facility approved by the appropriate federal authority;
- M. Pharmacies:
- N. Greenhouses;
- O. Seasonal stands engaged in sale of farm produce, dairy products, seafood or Christmas trees;
- P. Public utilities:
- Q. Industries normally kept in continuous operation, including, but not limited to, electric generation plants, pulp and paper plants and textile plants;
- puntation printed, purp und paper printed and control printed,
- R. Processing plants handling agricultural produce or products of the sea;

- S. Ship chandleries; 1 2 T. Marinas; 3 U. Establishments primarily selling boats, boating equipment, sporting equipment, souvenirs and novelties: 4 V. Motion picture theaters; 5 W. Public dancing; 6 X. Sports and athletic events; 7 8 Y. Bowling alleys; 9 Z. Displaying or exploding fireworks, under Title 8, chapter 9-A; 10 AA. Musical concerts; BB. Religious, educational, scientific or philosophical lectures; 11 CC. Scenic, historic, recreational and amusement facilities; 12 DD. Real estate brokers and real estate sales representatives; 13 EE. Mobile home brokers and mobile home sales representatives; 14 Stores in which no more than 5 persons, including the proprietor, are employed 15 in the usual and regular conduct of business: 16 GG. Stores that have no more than 5,000 square feet of interior customer selling 17 space, excluding back room storage, office and processing space; and 18 19 HH. Stores with more than 5,000 square feet of interior customer selling space that engage in retail sales and that do not require, as a condition of employment, that their 20 employees work on Sundays. If an employer decreases the average weekly work 21 hours of an employee who has declined to work on Sundays, it is prima facie 22 evidence that the employer has required Sunday work as a condition of employment 23 24 in violation of this section, unless the employer and employee agreed that the employee would work on Sundays when the employee was initially hired. In no 25 event, however, may any store having more than 5,000 square feet of interior 26 customer selling space be open on Easter Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas 27 Day. 28
- This subsection does not exempt the businesses or facilities specified in sections 3205 and, 3207 and 3210 from closing in any municipality until the requirements of those sections have been met.
  - Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §3210 is enacted to read:

#### §3210. Local option; grocery stores

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A municipality may by ordinance allow grocery stores with no more than 10,000 square feet of interior customer selling space to be open on Easter Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. For purposes of this subsection, "grocery store" has the same meaning as in Title 22, section 2491, subsection 7-B.

1	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this
2	legislation takes effect when approved.
3	SUMMARY
4	This bill allows a municipality by ordinance to allow grocery stores with no more
5	than 10,000 square feet of interior customer selling space to be open on Easter Day,
6	Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.
