3 4 5	4. Ballot questions. Notwithstanding Title 21-A, section 906, subsection 7, municipal initiative and referendum questions must be listed on the ballot using sequential capital letters of the alphabet instead of sequential numbers.
6 7 8	Sec. 2. 30-A MRSA §2528, sub-§6, ¶C, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 737, Pt. A, §2 and Pt. C, §106 and amended by PL 1989, c. 6; c. 9, §2; and c. 104, Pt. C, §§8 and 10, is further amended to read:

Any question or questions required by law to be submitted to a vote shall <u>must</u> be printed either below the list of candidates or on a separate ballot from the ballot listing candidates. <u>Notwithstanding Title 21-A, section 906, subsection 7, the questions must be listed on the ballot using sequential capital letters of the alphabet instead of sequential numbers. If a separate ballot is used, this ballot must be a different color than the ballot listing candidates.</u>

16 17 18	This bill requires that municipal initiative and referendum questions be listed on election ballots using sequential capital letters of the alphabet rather than sequential numbers.
