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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 38, L.D. 151, Bill, "An Act To Align State Law with Current Practice Regarding Required School Attendance"

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Amend the bill by inserting after section 2 the following:

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'Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA §4502, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:

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1-A. Developmentally appropriate educational practices; kindergarten to grade

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2. The commissioner shall adopt rules to address developmentally appropriate educational practices for kindergarten to grade 2. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are major substantive rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 275, subchapter 2-A.'

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Amend the bill by inserting after section 4 the following:

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'Sec. 5. **Basic approval standards; rulemaking.** The Commissioner of Education shall amend the Department of Education rule Chapter 125: Basic Approval Standards: Public Schools and School Administrative Units to address developmentally appropriate educational practices for kindergarten to grade 2. The rule must be amended to provide for:

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1. Classroom instruction with hands-on experiences with concrete materials and opportunities for students to interact with the world, ask questions, seek answers to questions and reflect on learning;

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2. Instruction that includes integration of learning experiences from all content areas arranged around themes relevant to the lives of students in kindergarten to grade 2; and

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3. An integrated school day that includes opportunities for student-centered and teacher-directed time combined with large and small group instruction.

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Rules adopted or amended pursuant to this section are major substantive rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A. The commissioner shall provisionally adopt the amended rules and submit the provisionally adopted rules to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council by January 10, 2020.'

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Changing the age at which children are required to begin attending school from 7 years of age to 6 years of age may result in increased costs to local school administrative units (SAU's) beginning in the 2019-2020 school year due to the potential for an increase in enrollment. The impact to individual local SAU's can not be determined and will depend on the number of 6 year-olds that enroll in school as a result of this legislation versus the number that would have enrolled absent this bill. School administrative units will begin receiving state subsidy for these students in the year following their enrollment in school based on the state contribution percentage for that year. If the total state funding is not increased to cover the additional cost, existing subsidy will be redistributed, with some SAU's receiving more funding than they would have received if this requirement had not been in place and some SAU's receiving less.

Additional costs to the Department of Education associated with the rulemaking process can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
