1 **SUMMARY** 2 This amendment strikes and replaces the bill. It: 1. Directs the Director of the Bureau of Maine Veterans' Services to establish a 3 4 program of partnerships, through one or more collaborative agreements, with human 5 services-based volunteer organizations to provide transitional housing to homeless veterans and coordinate efforts to remedy and prevent homelessness among veterans in 6 7 this State; 2. Provides that one of the priorities of the partnerships is to provide reimbursement 8 to human services-based volunteer organizations that provide transitional housing to 9 homeless veterans pursuant to collaborative agreements: 10 11 3. Authorizes the Bureau of Maine Veterans' Services to adopt rules necessary to implement this partnership program, including to define "veterans" for purposes of the 12 program, to govern collaborative agreements with human services-based volunteer 13 organizations and to govern the reimbursement of organizations that provide transitional 14 housing to homeless veterans through disbursements from the Veterans' Homelessness 15 Prevention Partnership Fund; 16 4. Establishes the Veterans' Homelessness Prevention Partnership Fund and provides 17 that it is to be used to reimburse human services-based volunteer organizations that 18 provide transitional housing to homeless veterans and to otherwise carry out the purposes 19 of the partnership program; 20 5. Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes an ongoing General Fund appropriation of \$600,000 beginning in fiscal year 2019-20 to the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management for reimbursements to human services-based volunteer organizations that provide transitional housing to homeless veterans. It also includes General Fund appropriations of \$171,429 in fiscal year 2019-20 and \$176,272 in fiscal year 2020-21 for one Office Associate II position to provide auditing and accounting services and for one Public Service Coordinator I position to manage and administer the veterans' homelessness prevention partnership program.

The bill establishes the Veterans' Homelessness Prevention Partnership Fund within the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management with a base Other Special Revenue Funds allocation of \$500 annually beginning in fiscal year 2019-20 to allow expenditure of any revenue received from any source for the purposes of the program.
