9 10	COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 231, L.D. 307, Bill, "An Act To Limit the Number of Charter Schools in Maine"
11	Amend the bill by striking out all of section 2 and inserting the following:
12	'Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §2405, sub-§10 is enacted to read:
13	10. Limit on number of public charter schools. No more than 10 public charter
14	schools may operate at any time. Any time the cap is reached, the commissioner may not
15 16	accept further registrations from the commission or from local school boards and collaboratives of local school boards.
17	Sec. 3. Public charter school charter revocation and nonrenewal. The
18	Maine Charter School Commission shall develop a process for the revocation or
19	nonrenewal of a public charter school's charter for public charter schools that are not
20 21	meeting required performance framework provisions and report to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs, no later than January 1, 2020, on the
21	recommended process and submit any suggested legislation to implement the process to
23	revoke or not renew a public charter school's charter.'
24	Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
25	section number to read consecutively.
26	SUMMARY
27	This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, caps the total number
28	of public charter schools in the state to 10 public charter schools, regardless of whether
29 30	the public charter school is authorized by the commission or by local school boards or collaboratives of local school boards.
31 32	This amendment also directs the Maine Charter School Commission to develop a process for the revocation or nonrenewal of a public charter school's charter for public
33	charter schools that are not meeting required performance framework provisions and
34	report to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs, no later than

Additional costs to the Maine Charter School Commission to implement the requirements of this legislation can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.

Limiting the number of public charter schools that may operate in the State at any one time to 10 will not affect the total cost of K-12 public education or the distribution of the State's contribution to the total cost, as there are currently 9 public charter schools operating in the State.
