### Correctional and Judicial Impact Statements

Possible reduction in costs to the Department of Corrections and to Indigent Legal Services from fewer arrests and prosecutions.

Minor reduction of workload associated with the minimal number of cases that will no longer be filed in the court system.

A reduction in fine revenue will decrease General Fund and dedicated revenue by minor amounts.
