	De it enacted by the reopie of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2308, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
4 5	6. Penalty. A violation of subsection 2 or 3 is a Class E crime, which notwithstanding Title 17-A, section 1301, is punishable by:
6 7	A. A \$500 fine and a suspension of a driver's license for not more than 30 days for the first offense; and
8 9 10	B. A fine of not less than \$1,000 and a suspension of a driver's license for not less than 30 days for a 2nd or subsequent offense occurring within 5 years of the first offense.
