SUMMARY 18 19 This amendment is the minority report of the committee. It amends the bill to: 20 1. Require the architect and construction manager costs to be included as part of the cost of the design and construction of the new building to accommodate the office of the 21 22 York County district attorney. The bill includes those costs as part of the new Biddeford 23 courthouse construction costs; and 2. Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill authorizes the issuance of up to \$6,000,000 in Maine Government Facilities Authority securities to construct a building to accommodate the office of the district attorney of York County. The building will be connected to a new courthouse that was previously authorized by earlier legislation. The county will pay the debt service on the bonds until they are paid in full, at which time the judicial branch will transfer the property to York County.
