Resolved: That the 4 Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation shall conduct an independent 5 assessment pursuant to the sunrise review requirements in the Maine Revised Statutes, 6 Title 32, chapter 1-A, subchapter 2 of the proposal to license building contractors, 7 insulation installers and energy auditors.

8 Sec. 2. Reporting date established. Resolved: That no later than January 10, 9 2020 the Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation shall submit a report 10 with any necessary legislation following the independent assessment under section 1 to 11 the Joint Standing Committee on Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and 12 Commerce. The committee is authorized to submit legislation on the subject matter of the 13 report to the Second Regular Session of the 129th Legislature.

SUMMARY

This bill requires the Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation to conduct an assessment pursuant to the sunrise review requirements in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, chapter 1-A, subchapter 2 of the licensing of building contractors, insulation installers and energy auditors. The bill requires the commissioner to submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Innovation, Development, Economic Advancement and Commerce and allows the committee to submit legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 129th Legislature.
