An Act To Improve the Ability of Mental Health Professionals To Assess the Risk of Suicide

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §3835, as amended by PL 2013, c. 262, §2, is further amended
by adding after the first paragraph a new paragraph to read:

Beginning January 1, 2020, a person who submits an application for license renewal
 shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of the board successful completion of a minimum of
 hours of course work in the previous 10 years in suicide prevention, evidence-based
 suicide risk assessment or the treatment and management of suicidal persons, including
 knowledge of community resources and cultural factors. Continuing education courses
 taken pursuant to this paragraph may be used to satisfy the licensee's other continuing
 education requirements.

11 Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §7060, as amended by PL 2013, c. 262, §4, is further amended 12 by adding after the first paragraph a new paragraph to read:

Beginning January 1, 2020, a person who submits an application for license renewal shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of the board successful completion of a minimum of hours of course work in the previous 10 years in suicide prevention, evidence-based suicide risk assessment or the treatment and management of suicidal persons, including knowledge of community resources and cultural factors. Continuing education courses taken pursuant to this paragraph may be used to satisfy the licensee's other continuing education requirements.

- Sec. 3. 32 MRSA §13858, sub-§2, ¶B, as amended by PL 2013, c. 262, §5, is

- B. Two years of experience after obtainment of a master's degree or a doctoral degree to include at least 3,000 hours of supervised clinical experience with a minimum of 100 hours of personal supervision; and
- Sec. 4. 32 MRSA §13858, sub-§2, ¶C, as enacted by PL 2013, c. 262, §5, is
 amended to read:

C. Beginning January 1, 2020 2022, demonstrated to the satisfaction of the board 27 28 successful completion of a minimum of 12 hours of course work in family or intimate 29 partner violence, including course work in spousal or partner abuse that addresses screening, referral and intervention strategies, including knowledge of community 30 resources, cultural factors, evidence-based risk assessment and same-gender abuse 31 dynamics. An applicant may fulfill this requirement through course work taken in 32 fulfillment of other educational requirements for licensure or through separate course 33 work provided through contact hours, Internet hours or distance learning programs, as 34 evidenced by certification from an accredited educational institution. The board shall 35 accept certification from the accredited educational institution from which the 36 37 applicant is a graduate that verifies the applicant's satisfaction of this requirement 38 within the applicant's completed course curriculum. An applicant for initial licensure that is unable to demonstrate completion of the requirements of this paragraph at the 39 time the initial application is submitted shall demonstrate to the board that these 40

requirements have been fulfilled upon the applicant's first application for license
 renewal-; and

3 Sec. 5. 32 MRSA §13858, sub-§2, ¶D is enacted to read:

D. Beginning January 1, 2020, demonstrated to the satisfaction of the board successful completion of a minimum of 6 hours of course work in the previous 10 years in suicide prevention, evidence-based suicide risk assessment or the treatment and management of suicidal persons, including knowledge of community resources and cultural factors. Continuing education courses taken pursuant to this paragraph may be used to satisfy the licensee's other continuing education requirements.

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SUMMARY

This bill adds a new requirement for the renewal of professional licenses for 11 12 psychologists, social workers and licensed clinical professional counselors that each must show proof upon renewal that the licensee has completed a minimum of 6 hours of course 13 work every 10 years in suicide prevention, evidence-based suicide risk assessment or the 14 treatment and management of suicidal persons, including knowledge of community 15 resources and cultural factors. These courses may be used to satisfy the licensee's other 16 continuing education requirements. The bill also changes, from January 1, 2020 to 17 January 1, 2022, the date that licensed clinical professional counselors must begin 18 demonstrating successful completion of a minimum of 12 hours of course work in family 19 or intimate partner violence. 20
