An Act To Increase Funding for the St. Croix International Waterway Commission

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

ST. CROIX INTERNATIONAL WATERWAY COMMISSION

St. Croix International Waterway Commission 0576

Initiative: Increases ongoing funding to the St. Croix International Waterway Commission to cover increased operational costs and for a portion of the cost of one full-time Administrative Assistant position. The funding is contingent upon the Province of New Brunswick, Canada providing a matching amount to the commission.

Sec. 2. Contingent effective date. This Act takes effect only if the St. Croix International Waterway Commission notifies the Commissioner of Environmental Protection and the State Controller that the Province of New Brunswick, Canada has committed to providing at least \$25,000 per fiscal year to cover the increased operational costs of the commission and a portion of the cost of one full-time Administrative Assistant position.

21 SUMMARY

This bill provides an additional \$25,000 per fiscal year to the St. Croix International Waterway Commission but only if the Province of New Brunswick, Canada commits to match the funding.
