10	Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 1 and inserting the following:				
11	'Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §6602, sub-§12, as amended by PL 2015, c. 267, Pt. OOO,				
12	§1, is further amended to read:				
13	12. Local Produce Fund. The Local Produce Fund is established within the				
14	department. The fund is authorized to receive revenue from public and private sources.				
15	The fund must be held separate and apart from all other money, funds and accounts. Any				
16	balance remaining in the fund at the end of the fiscal year must be carried forward to the				
17 18	next fiscal year. The fund must be used to match \$1 for every \$3 a school administrative unit pays for produce or minimally processed foods purchased directly from a farmer,				
18	farmers' cooperative or local food hub in the State, to a maximum state contribution of				
20	\$1,000 per school administrative unit in fiscal year 2019-20 and \$1,500 per school				
21	administrative unit in fiscal year 2020-21 and subsequent years or \$2,000 per school				
22	administrative unit if funding is received and the school administrative unit sends a food				
23	service employee to local foods training administered by the department under subsection				
24	13. At the end of the fiscal year, the school administrative unit may provide the				
25	department with receipts documenting purchases pursuant to this subsection during that				
26 27	year. For purposes of this subsection, "minimally processed" means only the washing,				
27 28	cleaning, trimming, drying, sorting and packaging of food items or a combination of those activities. Reimbursement or partial reimbursement to school administrative units				
28 29	may only be made up to the amount available in the fund. Failure to reimburse does not				
30	constitute an obligation on behalf of the State to a school administrative unit. The				
31	department shall apply for federal grant funding to provide state contributions in excess				
32	of \$1,000 per school administrative unit in fiscal year 2019-20 and \$1,500 per school				
33	administrative unit in fiscal year 2020-21 and subsequent years pursuant to this				
34	subsection if applicable grant funding is available. The department may accept grant				
35	funding from hospitals and other sources to provide state contributions in excess of				
36	\$1,000 per school administrative unit in fiscal year 2019-20 and \$1,500 per school				
37	administrative unit in fiscal year 2020-21 and subsequent years pursuant to this				
38	subsection.'				

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SENATE AMENDMENT

SUMMARY

This amendment provides that the state match for the purchase of produce or minimally processed foods purchased directly from a farmer, farmers' cooperative or local food hub in the State is \$1,000 per school administrative unit in fiscal year 2019-20 and \$1,500 per school administrative unit in fiscal year 2020-21 and subsequent years. This amendment also eliminates the General Fund appropriations in the bill.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment eliminates the ongoing General Fund appropriations totaling \$274,025 in fiscal year 2019-20 and \$420,746 in fiscal year 2020-21 to the School Finance and Operations program within the Department of Education to support the provision of the Local Produce Fund established pursuant to Title 20-A, section 6602, subsection 12. Funding for the same provisions are included in LD 1001, the 2020-2021 biennial budget.

As amended, this bill has no fiscal impact.
