COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 138, L.D. 474, "Resolve, To Ensure the Health and Wellness of Older Residents of the State"

Amend the resolve by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'Resolve, To Establish a Medically Tailored Food Pilot Project'

Amend the resolve by striking out all of section 1.

Amend the resolve in section 2 in the 7th line (page 1, line 13 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "homebound or" and inserting the following: 'homebound and'

Amend the resolve in section 2 in the 8th line (page 1, line 14 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "The program" and inserting the following: 'If the waiver is approved, the department shall implement the pilot project as soon as practically possible. The pilot project'

Amend the resolve in section 2 in the 13th and 14th lines (page 1, lines 19 and 20 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "July 1, 2022" and inserting the following: 'January 1, 2023'

Amend the resolve by striking out all of section 3 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 3. Appropriations and allocations. Resolved: That the following appropriations and allocations are made.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

1 homebound individuals. The amendment also clarifies that the demonstration waiver for
2 medically tailored foods applies to individuals who are 60 years of age or older,
3 homebound and at risk for readmission to a health care facility. It changes the date for
4 reporting on the 2-year pilot project to January 1, 2023 and clarifies that the pilot project
5 goes forward only if the waiver is approved by the Federal Government.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes General Fund appropriations to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$65,656 in fiscal year 2019-20 and \$50,647 in fiscal year 2020-21 for reimbursement for 2 weeks of medically tailored food and nutrition interventions for certain inpatients at high risk of readmission and one-time funding for Maine Integrated Health Management System technology changes required to process medically tailored meals claims. Federal Expenditures Fund allocations are also included for the FMAP match.
