## An Act To Extend the Limitation on Prescribing Opioids for Certain Individuals with Chronic Pain

4	SUMMARY
5	Current law prohibits an individual licensed to prescribe opioid medication from
6	prescribing more than a 30-day supply of an opioid medication to a patient under
7	treatment for chronic pain. This bill allows an individual licensed to prescribe opioid
8	medication to prescribe no more than a 6-month supply of an opioid medication to a
9	patient under treatment for chronic pain who has been prescribed medication for chronic
10	pain continually for at least 5 years or is 63 years of age or older.
