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and national organizations with a recognized expertise related to dementias that are

beneficial to the State's individuals and families affected by dementia. Other tasks of the

coordinator include, but are not limited to, collecting data on the incidence of dementia,

increasing awareness and creating training programs to facilitate access to services in all

areas of the State, identifying and managing grants and contracts associated with services

and providing policy advice to departments, municipalities and community organizations providing support and services to individuals and families affected by dementia. The

department shall submit a report no later than January 30th of each year beginning in

2020 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters that outlines the activities of the coordinator and the

department regarding programs and services for the State's individuals and families
