4	D. Science, including at least one year of laboratory study2 years; and
5	E. Fine arts, which may include art, music, forensics or dramaone year-; and
6	Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §4722, sub-§2, ¶F is enacted to read:
7	F. Career and education developmentone semester or its equivalent.
