Whereas, instability of these behavioral health services could lead to a need for more expensive treatments; and Whereas, this legislation requires that an amendment to rules to address this inequality be made by July 1, 2019; and Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now therefore, be it Sec. 1. Department of Health and Human Services to increase MaineCare rates. Resolved: That, no later than July 1, 2019, the Department of Health and Human Services shall amend rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual Chapter III, Section 65, Behavioral Health Services to increase reimbursement rates by 8%. The rule must specify that the increase in reimbursement rates must be applied to					
Whereas, unequal rates of reimbursement for employees providing direct care services create huge barriers to employment and retention; and Whereas, instability of the direct care services workforce reduces access to services by those in need of them; and Whereas, a lack of receipt of these behavioral health services could lead to a need for more expensive treatments; and Whereas, this legislation requires that an amendment to rules to address this inequality be made by July 1, 2019; and Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now therefore, be it Sec. 1. Department of Health and Human Services to increase MaineCare rates. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and			
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- **Sec. 2.** Increase to employee wages. Resolved: That to qualify for the reimbursement rate increase pursuant to section 1, an agency providing services must demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Department of Health and Human Services, that an increase in wages and benefits has been granted to employees providing direct care services that equals the amount of the projected increase in reimbursement to be received. The increase in wages and benefits must be paid or granted retroactively from the date the department begins reimbursing at the increased rates.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.

11 SUMMARY

This resolve provides funding to increase rates by 8% in rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter III, Section 65, Behavioral Health Services. The resolve also specifies that the increase in reimbursement rates must be applied to wages and benefits for employees who provide direct care services and not to administrators or managers and that to qualify for the rate increase an agency providing services must demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Department of Health and Human Services, that an increase in wages and benefits has been granted to employees providing direct care services that equals the amount of the projected increase in reimbursement to be received.
