SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 209,
9 L.D. 696, Bill, "An Act To Protect Public Employees from Identity Theft"

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Amend the amendment in section 2 by striking out all of the last blocked paragraph
11 (page 2, lines 8 to 13 in amendment) and inserting the following:

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'The notices required under paragraphs A and B must be made as expeditiously as possible
13 and without unreasonable delay, consistent with the legitimate needs of law enforcement
14 pursuant to subsection 3 or with measures necessary to determine the scope of the
15 security breach and restore the reasonable integrity, security and confidentiality of the
16 data in the system. If there is no delay of notification due to law enforcement
17 investigation pursuant to subsection 3, the notices must be made no more than 30 days
18 after the person identified in paragraph A or B becomes aware of a breach of security and
19 identifies its scope.'

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SUMMARY

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This amendment specifies that the requirement to provide notice of a breach of
22 security within 30 days applies only if there is not a delay due to a law enforcement
23 investigation.
