SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 214, L.D. 701, Bill, "An Act To Modernize the National School Lunch Program and the School Breakfast Program"

Amend the amendment by inserting after the title the following:

'Amend the bill by striking out all of the emergency preamble (page 1, lines 1 to 9 in L.D.).'

Amend the amendment by inserting after section 1 the following:

'Amend the bill in section 2 in the 3rd line (page 1, line 26 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "August" and inserting the following: 'October"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 3 and inserting the following:

- 'Sec. 3. Transfer of funds. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the State Controller shall transfer to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund \$650,000 no later than June 30, 2020 and \$150,000 no later than June 30, 2021 from the Medical Use of Marijuana Fund, established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 2430.
- Sec. 4. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

#### EDUCATION, DEPARTMENT OF

### Alternative Breakfast Delivery Service Program N318

Initiative: Provides one-time funding in fiscal year 2019-20 only to school administrative units that start or expand alternative breakfast delivery services that provide breakfast after the start of the school day. A school administrative unit with a public school in which at least 50% of students qualified for a free or reduced-price lunch during the preceding school year qualifies for funding. The department is required to develop guidelines to allocate and disburse the funding to participating schools. Guidelines must be developed within 90 days following the effective date of this Act. Funding appropriated to this program does not lapse but must be carried forward into the next fiscal year to be used only for the purpose for which it was provided.

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

This amendment adds a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$500,000 in fiscal year 2019-20 to school administrative units that start or expand alternative breakfast delivery services that provide breakfast after the start of the school day.

It reduces the General Fund appropriations by \$66,000 per year from \$216,000 to \$150,000 beginning in fiscal year 2019-20 to the Department of Education for the cost to develop and implement the Internet-based application.

This amendment also adds one-time transfers of \$650,000 in fiscal year 2019-20 and \$150,000 in fiscal year 2020-21 to the unappropriated surplus of the General Fund from the Medical Use of Marijuana Fund.
