3	§458. Recording of suspect interviews
4 5 6 7	Any questioning of a person by a law enforcement officer as defined in Title 17-A, section 2, subsection 17 who is in custody or otherwise deprived of freedom of action in any significant way must be recorded upon a sound recording device whenever feasible and in any case where questioning occurs at a place of detention.
8	SUMMARY
9	Current law requires that law enforcement agencies only adopt written policies for
10	the recording of interviews of suspects of serious crimes. This bill requires law
11	enforcement officers to record interviews of suspects in custody or otherwise deprived of
12	freedom of action in any significant way whenever feasible and always where questioning
13	occurs at a place of detention.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

1
