Amend the resolve in section 1 in subsection 1 in the first line (page 1, line 15 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "17" and inserting the following: '20'

Amend the resolve in section 1 in subsection 1 by striking out all of paragraph G (page 1, lines 26 to 36 and page 2, line 1 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

'G. Nine individuals appointed by the Governor:

(1) A representative of a statewide association of prosecutors nominated by the association;

(2) A representative of a statewide association of county commissioners nominated by the association;

(3) A representative of a statewide association of county sheriffs nominated by the association;

(4) A representative of a statewide association of criminal defense lawyers nominated by the association;

- (5) A representative of a statewide organization representing people with mental
  illness and their families;
  - (6) A member of the public;
  - (7) A representative of a statewide organization working to end domestic violence;
- 30 (8) A representative of a statewide organization working to end sexual assault;
  31 and
  - (9) A member of a federally recognized tribe in the State; and

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT 'A " to H.P. 603, L.D. 829

Amend the resolve in section 1 in subsection 3 in paragraph A in subparagraph (1) in the first line (page 2, line 15 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "overall" the following: 'juvenile and adult'

Amend the resolve in section 1 in subsection 3 in paragraph A in subparagraph (6) in the first line (page 2, line 23 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "increasing" the following: 'juvenile and adult'

Amend the resolve in section 1 in subsection 3 in paragraph B in the 3rd line (page 2, line 30 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "including" the following: 'diversion from juvenile corrections,'

Amend the resolve in section 1 in subsection 3 in paragraph B in subparagraph (1) in the first line (page 2, line 35 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "increasing" the following: 'juvenile and adult'

Amend the resolve by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
 section number to read consecutively.

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#### SUMMARY

This amendment adds 3 members to the membership of the Commission To Improve the Sentencing, Supervision, Management and Incarceration of Prisoners: a representative of a statewide organization working to end domestic violence; a representative of a statewide organization working to end sexual assault; and a member of a federally recognized tribe in Maine. The amendment adds to the duties of the commission specific mention of juvenile and adult prisoner populations and diversion from juvenile corrections.

### **Fiscal Note**

Legislative Cost/Study

#### Legislative Cost/Study

The general operating expenses of this study are projected to be \$2,000 in fiscal year 2019-20. An estimated \$6,120 is available in each of fiscal years 2019-20 and 2020-21 in the Legislature's proposed budget for legislative studies as well as any balances from prior years for this purpose. Whether these amounts are sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature.

#### **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

The bill requires the Department of Corrections (DOC) to provide any necessary staffing assistance to the commission. Any costs to the DOC to staff the commission can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.

Any additional costs to the departments or agencies whose commissioners, directors or their designees are required to serve on the Commission To Improve Sentencing, Supervision, Management and Incarceration of Prisoners are assumed to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
