Resolved: That the Task Force To Study the Coordination of Services and Expansion of Educational Programs for Young Adults with Disabilities, referred to in this resolve as "the task force," is established to develop recommendations to enhance the coordination of programs for young adults with disabilities and to recommend targeted reforms to ensure the most efficient and effective provision of services for young adults with disabilities.

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## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 626, L.D. 852

- 1. One member who serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing 2 appointed by the President of the Senate; 2. One member who serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs appointed by the Speaker of the House; 4 3. One member who serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services appointed by the Speaker of the House; 6 4. The Commissioner of Education or the commissioner's designee;
  - 5. The Commissioner of Health and Human Services or the commissioner's designee;
  - 6. The Commissioner of Labor or the commissioner's designee; and
  - 7. Eight members appointed by the Commissioner of Education, in consultation with the Commissioner of Health and Human Services and the Commissioner of Labor, as follows:
    - A. One member who represents an advocacy organization for young adults with disabilities:
    - B. One member who represents a statewide organization of parents of young adults with disabilities;
    - C. One member who represents a statewide association for adult education;
  - D. One member who represents a statewide association for career and technical education:
    - E. One member who represents the University of Maine System;
    - F. One member who represents the Maine Community College System;
    - G. One member who represents a statewide association of administrators of services for children with disabilities; and
      - H. One member who represents community-based providers of services for young adults with disabilities.
    - Sec. 3. Chair; meetings. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Education shall appoint a chair of the task force and convene the initial meeting of the task force no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The task force shall hold a minimum of 4 meetings.
    - Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall study the barriers to efficient and effective services for young adults with disabilities after high school and make recommendations on targeted reforms to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of these services, including but not limited to:
      - 1. The coordination of services provided by different agencies; and
    - 2. The benefits, assessments, expansion and availability of continuing educational opportunities for young adults with disabilities after high school.
  - Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Department of Education shall provide the task force with staff assistance from existing resources.

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#### **SUMMARY**

This amendment establishes the Task Force To Study the Coordination of Services and Expansion of Educational Programs for Young Adults with Disabilities. The membership of the task force consists of Legislators who serve on the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and cultural affairs, health and human services matters and labor and housing matters, the Commissioner of Education, the Commissioner of Health and Human Services and the Commissioner of Labor and members of organizations or associations knowledgeable about services for young adults with disabilities after high school. The Commissioner of Education convenes the task force, which must hold a minimum of 4 meetings and submit a report to the joint standing committees of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education and cultural affairs, health and human services matters and labor and housing matters on recommendations and targeted reforms to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of services provided by different agencies and continuing educational opportunities for young adults with disabilities after high school.

## Legislative Cost/Study

The general operating expenses of this study are projected to be \$1,500 in fiscal year 2019-20. An estimated \$6,190 is available in each of fiscal years 2019-20 and 2020-21 in the Legislature's proposed budget for legislative studies as well as any balances from prior years for this purpose. Whether these amounts are sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature.

## Fiscal Detail and Notes

The Department of Education has indicated it will require funding to reimburse certain task force members for mileage and to prepare the final report. The bill includes a one-time General Fund appropriation of \$3,112 in fiscal year 2019-20 to the Leadership Team program within the Department of Education.

This bill also includes a one-time Other Special Revenue Funds allocation of \$500 in fiscal year 2019-20 to a newly created Task Force to Enhance Continuing Education Programs for Young Adults with Disabilities program within the department to allow expenditure of any outside funding that might be received to support the task force.

Any additional costs to the Department of Health and Human Services, the Department of Labor, the University of Maine System and the Maine Community College System to serve on the task force are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
