## **Resolve, To Establish and Fund Interventions for At-risk Families and Children**

1 Sec. 1. Evidence-based practices services for at-risk families and 2 children. Resolved: That the Department of Health and Human Services shall provide 3 grants to behavioral health providers to fund the costs of attracting, retaining and training new professional employees to deliver evidence-based outpatient psychosocial treatment 4 services for children and families involved in the child protective services known as 5 "functional family therapy - child welfare" and "multisystemic therapy for child abuse 6 and neglect." The department shall consult with behavioral health providers to develop a 7 8 rate of reimbursement for these services under MaineCare and amend its rules under rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Sections 28 and 65 accordingly. The rate 9 must take into account the costs to providers of delivering services, including for 10 11 additional training and maintenance of fidelity to the treatment models. The department shall seek federal funding including under the Family First Prevention Services Act of 12 2017 to cover the costs to develop and provide the services under MaineCare. If federal 13 funding is not available for the costs to attract, retain and train new professional 14 employees, the department shall provide grants using general funds. 15

## SUMMARY

17 This resolve requires the Department of Health and Human Services to provide grants to behavioral health providers to fund costs to attract, retain and train new professional 18 employees to provide treatment services known as "functional family therapy - child 19 welfare" and "multisystemic therapy for child abuse and neglect" to children and families 20 21 involved in the child protective services. The department is required to develop a rate of reimbursement for these services under MaineCare and amend its rules in rule Chapter 22 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Sections 28 and 65 accordingly. The department is 23 required to seek federal funding including under the Family First Prevention Services Act 24 of 2017 for the grants. If federal funding is not available, the department is required to 25 provide grants using general funds. 26

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
