1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

2 **Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2422, sub-§1-F** is enacted to read:

3 **1-F. Caregiver retail store.** "Caregiver retail store" means a location other than the
4 permanent residence of a registered caregiver or a qualifying patient from which a
5 registered caregiver provides marijuana for medical use to a qualifying patient. For
6 purposes of this subsection, "permanent residence" has the same meaning as in Title 36,
7 section 681, subsection 3.

8 **Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §2423-A, sub-§2, ¶P,** as enacted by PL 2017, c. 452, §4, is
9 amended to read:

10 P. Operate one caregiver retail store to sell harvested marijuana to qualifying patients
11 for the patients' medical use in accordance with this chapter; and

12 **Sec. 3. 22 MRSA §2423-A, sub-§3, ¶C-1,** as enacted by PL 2017, c. 452, §4, is
13 amended to read:

14 C-1. A caregiver operating under paragraph C may engage in the conduct authorized
15 in subsection 2, except that a caregiver operating under paragraph C may not:

- 16 (1) Cultivate marijuana plants for more than 2 members of the family or members
17 of the same household;
- 18 (2) Cultivate more than 6 mature marijuana plants and 12 immature marijuana
19 plants for each qualifying patient who has designated the caregiver to cultivate
20 marijuana plants on the patient's behalf;
- 21 (3) Possess more than 8 pounds of harvested marijuana;
- 22 (4) Sell marijuana plants or harvested marijuana at wholesale under subsection 2,
23 paragraph K-1;
- 24 (5) Use a pesticide under subsection 2, paragraph J;
- 25 (6) Operate a caregiver retail store under subsection 2, paragraph P; or
- 26 (7) Organize as a business entity under subsection 2, paragraph Q.

27 **Sec. 4. 22 MRSA §2424, sub-§4, ¶B,** as enacted by PL 2017, c. 452, §10, is
28 amended to read:

29 B. Minimum security requirements for registered caregivers operating caregiver
30 retail stores pursuant to section ~~242-A~~ 2423-A, subsection 2, paragraph P and
31 registered dispensaries and any additional location at which a dispensary cultivates
32 marijuana plants for medical use by qualifying patients.

33 **Sec. 5. 22 MRSA §2429-D, sub-§2,** as enacted by PL 2017, c. 452, §18, is
34 amended to read:

35 **2. Stores, dispensaries, testing and manufacturing facilities.** Prohibit registered
36 caregiver retail stores, registered dispensaries, marijuana testing facilities and

1 manufacturing facilities that are operating with municipal approval in the municipality
2 prior to the effective date of this section. For purposes of this subsection, "municipal
3 approval" means a specific examination and approval of the underlying use of the store,
4 dispensary or facility, including a conditional use approval, site plan approval or issuance
5 of a marijuana-specific business license. "Municipal approval" does not include issuance
6 of a building, electrical or other similar permit that does not address the use of the
7 structure or facility for which the permit is issued; or

8 **SUMMARY**

9 This bill clarifies the Maine Medical Use of Marijuana Act by:

- 10 1. Standardizing the term "caregiver retail store" by creating a definition of the term
11 and replacing other variations of "retail store" in the Act with "caregiver retail store"; and
- 12 2. Defining "municipal approval" in the provisions regarding marijuana for medical
13 use caregiver retail stores, dispensaries and facilities operating before the effective date of
14 the Act as a specific examination and approval of the underlying use of the store,
15 dispensary or facility, including a conditional use approval, site plan approval or issuance
16 of a marijuana-specific business license and not including the issuance of a building,
17 electrical or other similar permit that does not address the use of the structure or facility
18 for which the permit was issued.
