This amendment provides that, beginning January 1, 2020, a person licensed as a dentist or dental hygienist with dental hygienist therapy authority may place a mercury amalgam filling in a tooth as part of a procedure that is covered by MaineCare only if the patient or the patient's parent or legal guardian signs a consent form. The signed form must be submitted with the request for reimbursement under MaineCare and a copy of the signed form must be retained in the patient's records for a period of at least 3 years for review during MaineCare recertification.
