The behavioral health crisis center must provide support and services 24 hours per day, 7 days per week to an individual in crisis until the crisis is resolved and the individual is connected with the appropriate community services. Services provided by the behavioral health crisis center must include rapid assessment, triage, active treatment with the goal of stabilizing the individual, reintegrating the individual with the community and connecting the individual to statewide crisis call centers, mobile response services and other community crisis services to ensure that the individual receives support in the least restrictive environment. The behavioral health crisis center must be located in a rural area of the State that is not in Cumberland County.
