19	Service credit for service in law enforcement is governed as follows.
20	1. Service before becoming member. A member who served as a full-time law

22	becoming a member is entitled under this subsection to purchase service credit for the
23	period of time that the member served as a law enforcement officer if the member has at
24	least 15 years of creditable service at the time of retirement by complying with the terms
25	and conditions of this subsection and the applicable provisions of subsection 2. Service
26	credit purchased under this section is limited to 4 years. Notwithstanding anything to the

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1015, L.D. 1400

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SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill. It allows a member of the State Employee and Teacher Retirement Program or the Participating Local District Retirement Program to purchase up to 4 years of service credit for time served as a full-time law enforcement officer prior to membership at full actuarial cost if the member has at least 15 years of creditable service at the time of retirement. The amendment also requires that the member certify that the service credit to be purchased has not and will not be used to obtain other retirement benefits. The amendment also clarifies that the purchase of service credit for time served as a full-time law enforcement officer may be applied to the requirement for creditable service of 25 years under the 1998 Special Plan.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

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Allowing a member of the State Employee and Teacher Retirement Program or the Participating Local District Retirement Program to purchase up to 4 years on service credit for time served as a full-time law enforcement officer prior to membership at the full actuarial cost if the member meets certain conditions will not increase costs to the State or participating local districts. The cost will be borne fully by the member.
