- 'Sec. 1. Department of Health and Human Services to examine opportunities to provide services to individuals experiencing homelessness, including a Section 1915(i) state plan amendment option. Resolved: That the Department of Health and Human Services shall examine opportunities available pursuant to a state plan amendment option under Section 1915(i) of the federal Social Security Act as well as any other Medicaid-funded mechanism that may be appropriate to provide home and community-based services to individuals experiencing homelessness.
- Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That, no later than February 1, 2020, the Department of Health and Human Services shall report its progress on identifying opportunities to provide services to individuals experiencing homelessness and any waiver applications or other appropriate mechanism pursuant to section 1 to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services.
- Sec. 3. Appropriations and allocations. Resolved: That the following appropriations and allocations are made.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes ongoing General Fund appropriations of \$500,000 per year beginning in fiscal year 2019-20 to the Temporary Housing Assistance Fund within the Maine State Housing Authority to assist low-income individuals to become stable tenants.

Any additional costs to the Department of Health and Human Services to examine opportunities to provide home and community based services to individuals experiencing homelessness and reporting back to the legislature are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
