RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine To Provide 4-year Terms for Senators and To Set Term Limits for Legislators

Presented by Senator CARPENTER of Aroostook. Cosponsored by Representative HARNETT of Gardiner and Senator: KEIM of Oxford, Representative: BAILEY of Saco. 1 **Constitutional amendment. Resolved:** Two thirds of each branch of the 2 Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be 3 proposed:

4 **Constitution, Art. II, §4** is amended to read:

5 Section 4. Time of state election; absentee voting. The election of Senators and Representatives shall be on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November 6 biennially forever and the election of, except as provided in this section. Beginning with 7 the general election held in 2022, the election of Senators and the Governor shall be on 8 the Tuesday following the first Monday of November every 4 years. The Legislature 9 under proper enactment shall authorize and provide for voting by citizens of the State 10 absent therefrom in the Armed Forces of the United States or of this State and for voting 11 by other citizens absent or physically incapacitated for reasons deemed sufficient. 12

13 **Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. First, §2** is amended to read:

Section 2. Number of Representatives; biennial terms; division of the 14 State into districts for House of Representatives. The House of Representatives 15 shall consist of 151 members, to be elected by the qualified electors, and hold their office 16 2 years from the day next preceding the first Wednesday in December following the 17 general election. Beginning in 2022, a person may not serve more than 6 consecutive 18 terms as a member of the House of Representatives. The Legislature which convenes in 19 2013, and also the Legislature which convenes in 2021 and every 10th year thereafter, 20 shall cause the State to be divided into districts for the choice of one Representative for 21 22 each district. The number of Representatives shall be divided into the number of inhabitants of the State exclusive of foreigners not naturalized according to the latest 23 24 Federal Decennial Census or a State Census previously ordered by the Legislature to coincide with the Federal Decennial Census, to determine a mean population figure for 25 each Representative District. Each Representative District shall be formed of contiguous 26 27 and compact territory and shall cross political subdivision lines the least number of times necessary to establish as nearly as practicable equally populated districts. Whenever the 28 population of a municipality entitles it to more than one district, all whole districts shall 29 be drawn within municipal boundaries. Any population remainder within the 30 municipality shall be included in a district with contiguous territory and shall be kept 31 32 intact.

33 **Constitution, Art. IV, Pt. Second, §§1 and 5** are amended to read:

Section 1. Number of Senators; terms. The Senate shall consist of an odd number of Senators, not less than 31 nor more than 35, elected at the same time and for the same term as Representatives by the qualified electors of the districts into which the State shall be from time to time divided except that, beginning with the general election held in 2022, Senators are elected as provided in Article II, Section 4. Beginning in 2022, a person may not serve more than 3 consecutive terms as a member of the Senate.

40 Section 5. Determination of Senators elected; procedure for filling
 41 vacancies. The Senate shall, on said first Wednesday of December, biennially <u>until the</u>

general election held in 2022 and quadrennially thereafter determine who is elected by a plurality of votes to be Senator in each district. All vacancies in the Senate arising from death, resignation, removal from the State or like causes, and also vacancies, if any, which may occur because of the failure of any district to elect by a plurality of votes the Senator to which said district shall be entitled shall be filled by an immediate election in the unrepresented district. The Governor shall issue a proclamation therefor and therein fix the time of such election.

8 **Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date.** 9 **Resolved:** That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their 10 respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for 11 holding a statewide election, at a statewide election held in the month of November 12 following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment 13 proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to change the term of
office for State Senators from 2 years to 4 years and change the number
of consecutive years members of the State Senate and House of
Representatives may serve from 8 years to 12 years?"

18 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding 19 square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and 20 declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of 21 State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall 22 23 review the returns. If it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment 24 becomes part of the Constitution of Maine on the date of the proclamation. 25

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State
 shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies
 of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

SUMMARY

This resolution proposes to amend the Constitution of Maine to change the term of office for State Senators from 2 years to 4 years and change the number of consecutive years members of the State Senate and House of Representatives may serve from 8 years to 12 years.

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
