Sec. 6. Department of Health and Human Services to amend rules. The Department of Health and Human Services shall amend its rules for services provided under rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapters II and III, Section 40 so that:

1. Reimbursement is provided for activities performed outside of the home by a registered nurse licensed under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, chapter 31 that are directly related to a member's care and are part of the member's plan of care; and

8 2. Reimbursement is provided for a pharmacist licensed under Title 32, chapter 117 9 to provide medication evaluation or consultation to a member in a home visit when 10 technology is not the most effective mode of consultation.

11 Sec. 7. Federal regulations; rules. The Department of Health and Human 12 Services shall amend its rules for services provided under rule Chapter 101: MaineCare 13 Benefits Manual, Chapter II, Section 40 to allow a certified nurse practitioner licensed 14 under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, chapter 31 and a physician assistant licensed 15 under Title 32, chapter 36 or 48 to authorize or amend a plan of care as soon as federal 16 regulations allowing it are promulgated.'

SUMMARY

This amendment removes the sections of the bill that establish the Social 21 22 Determinants of Health Stakeholder Advisory Group within the Department of Health 23 and Human Services, requires review of certain home-based and community-based 24 MaineCare reimbursement rates every 2 years and convenes a work group to review options for adjusting reimbursement rates for home-based and community-based services. 25 26 It requires the department to amend its rules for reimbursement for pharmacists 27 conducting a medication evaluation or consultation in the home. It clarifies that certified 28 nurse practitioners and physician assistants may only authorize or amend a plan of care 29 under rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter II, Section 40 after the 30 Federal Government allows for it. It adds making recommendations to the department on 31 best practices to the additional duties of the Maine Telehealth and Telemonitoring 32 Advisory Group included in the bill. It also adds an appropriations and allocations 33 section.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes General Fund appropriations to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$499,892 in fiscal year 2019-20 and \$428,211 in fiscal year 2020-21 to allow that reimbursement is provided for activities performed outside of the home by a registered nurse that are directly related to a member's care and are part of the member's plan of care and for required technology changes. Federal Expenditures Fund allocations are also included for the FMAP match.
