 10 Use of Aerial Herbicide Spraying for the Purpose of Deforestation"
- 11 Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'Resolve, Directing the Board of Pesticides Control To Work with the Forest Products Industry To Monitor Aerial Herbicide Applications'

14 Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:

'Sec. 1. Monitoring of aerial herbicide applications. Resolved: That the 15 Board of Pesticides Control, established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 16 1471-B, shall work with representatives of the forest products industry who conduct 17 aerial application of herbicides for the purpose of silviculture, including reforestation, 18 19 regeneration or vegetation control, to monitor aerial applications of herbicides through a 20 neutral 3rd-party entity determined by the board. The one-time monitoring of aerial applications required under this section is contingent upon the receipt of outside funds for 21 this purpose. The board shall report to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, 22 23 Conservation and Forestry with findings and recommendations related to the monitoring of aerial herbicide application no later than February 1, 2020. The monitoring of aerial 24 25 applications of herbicides must conclude upon submission of the report to the joint standing committee. The joint standing committee may submit a bill relating to the 26 27 subject matter of the report to the Second Regular Session of the 129th Legislature.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

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SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, strikes the bill and replaces it with a resolve. The amendment requires the Board of Pesticides Control within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to work with representatives of the forest products industry over the next several months to monitor

aerial applications of herbicides through a neutral 3rd-party entity determined by the board and at the cost of the forest products industry.

The amendment requires the board to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry by February 1, 2020.
