SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the minority report of the committee, strikes and replaces
the bill. The amendment prohibits the aerial application of glyphosate or other synthetic
herbicides for the purpose of silviculture, including reforestation, regeneration or
vegetation control after a timber harvest.
