6 7	Hazardous Materials Safety Administration, the excavator shall immediately report the contact or damage by calling 9-1-1.
8	SUMMARY
9	This bill requires excavators to call 9-1-1 if contact with or damage to an
10	underground pipe or another underground facility results in the escape of any natural gas
11	or other hazardous substance or material regulated by the United States Department of
12	Transportation, Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
