8 9 10	E. Procedures for fingerprint-based criminal history record checks of national crime information databases, as defined in 28 United States Code, Section 534(f)(3)(A), and child abuse and neglect registry checks for all staff working in the facility.
11	SUMMARY
12	This bill requires the Department of Health and Human Services to adopt rules for
13 14	children's residential care facilities that include procedures for fingerprint-based background checks and child abuse and neglect registry checks for all staff working in the
14	facility to ensure compliance with the requirements governing fingerprint-based
16	background checks contained in federal family first prevention services legislation.
