6 7 8 9	C. Wine may be served only to be consumed on the premises when accompanied by a full meal if a full meal is available for purchase and consumption on the premises. For the purposes of this paragraph, "full meal" means a diversified selection of food that cannot ordinarily be consumed without the use of tableware and cannot be conveniently consumed while standing or walking;

13 14	E. A licensee may not serve wine to be consumed on the premises after $\frac{8:00}{10:00}$ p.m.

16 17 18 19 20 21 22	This bill makes changes to the laws governing dual liquor licenses. It allows a licensee to serve wine until 10 p.m., rather than until 8 p.m. It removes the restriction that wine may be served to be consumed on the premises only when accompanied by a full meal and instead requires only that a full meal be available for purchase and consumption. It removes the requirement that a licensee have 2 employees at least 21 years of age present at all times in order to serve wine for on-premises consumption and sell wine for off-premises consumption.
