SUMMARY

This amendment strikes and replaces the bill. The amendment directs the Department 19 of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Board of Pesticides Control to establish an 20 environmental risk advisory committee to evaluate the environmental risks associated 21 with the use of neonicotinoids, particularly the impact the use of neonicotinoids has on 22 pollinator species, including, but not limited to, native Maine bee species and other insect 23 pollinators and bird species. The advisory committee is required to submit an interim 24 report by March 2021 and a final report by February 2022 with findings and 25 recommendations to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 26 over agricultural matters. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having 27 jurisdiction over agricultural matters has the authority to submit a bill relating to the 28 29 subject matter of the report during the Second Regular Session of the 130th Legislature.

The amendment also provides funding necessary to carry out the requirements of this legislation.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill directs the Board of Pesticides Control (BPC), within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, to establish an environmental risk advisory committee to assess the environmental risks associated with the use of neonicotinoids and complete a final report of their findings by February 1, 2022. The BPC has indicated that it will require additional staffing to complete these tasks. The bill includes additional allocations of \$103,540 to the BPC to allow expenditure of existing resources for one toxicologist, contracted staffing, environmental sampling and literature review. The impact of these new unfunded costs on other programs in the BPC cannot be determined at this time.
