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SUMMARY

10 This amendment changes the membership of the Criminal Records Review Committee. It removes the Commissioner of Corrections, the President of the Maine 11 12 Sheriffs' Association, a representative of an organization that provides legal assistance on immigration, a representative of an adult and juvenile prisoners' rights organization and a 13 representative of a nonprofit organization whose mission includes advocating for victims 14 and survivors of sexual assault from the committee. It adds the President of the Maine 15 Chiefs of Police Association or the president's designee and a member of the press to the 16 committee. It adds the following to the list of individuals and organizations from whom 17 the committee must invite comments and suggestions: juvenile justice reform advocates, 18 restorative justice advocates, individuals or organizations that provide legal assistance in 19 immigration matters, the Secretary of State and the Department of Professional and 20 21 Financial Regulation.
