20 21	Whereas, this legislation affects obligations and expenses during the course of the current fiscal year and requires immediate attention; and
22 23	Whereas, current state reimbursement rates for services providing long-term supports and services do not account for the current minimum wage requirements; and

- 3. Attendant care services, personal care services, respite care services, home health aide services and certified nursing assistant services provided under the provisions of 10-149 C.M.R. Chapter 5, Office of Aging and Disability Services Policy Manual, Section 63, In-home and Community Support Services for Elderly and Other Adults;

#### **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

The bill includes General Fund appropriations to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$21,887,977 in fiscal year 2020-21 for a rate increase of \$2 an hour for certain services. Federal Expenditures Fund allocations are also included for the FMAP match and Other Special Revenue Funds allocations for the Service Provider Tax.
