1 2	Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
3 4	Whereas, this legislation allows an employee to request family medical leave to care for a grandchild who has a serious health condition; and
5 6 7	Whereas, this legislation needs to take effect as soon as possible in order to allow grandparents to take family medical leave in order to care for their grandchildren, especially in light of the increasing number of COVID-19 cases; and
8 9 10 11	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
12	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
13 14	Sec. 1. 26 MRSA §843, sub-§4, ¶D, as repealed and replaced by PL 2007, c. 519, §1, is amended to read:
15 16	D. A child, domestic partner's child, grandchild, domestic partner's grandchild, parent, domestic partner, sibling or spouse with a serious health condition;
17 18	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.
19	SUMMARY
20 21	This bill allows a grandparent to request employee family medical leave in order to care for a grandchild who has a serious health condition.
