A person may not conduct an aerial application of glyphosate or other synthetic herbicides for the purpose of silviculture, including reforestation, regeneration or vegetation control after any timber harvest, including but not limited to a timber harvesting activity conducted in accordance with Title 12 chapter 805, subchapter 3-A.
