Resolve, To Ensure That Community Mental Health Service Providers Can Access Pandemic Stimulus Funds

Sec. 1. Department of Health and Human Services to designate COVID-19 stimulus funding for community mental health service providers. Resolved: That, to the extent resources are available from federal funding allocated to the State in any federal law enacted after December 15, 2020 that provides stimulus funds due to the ongoing pandemic related to coronavirus disease 2019, or COVID-19, the Department of Health and Human Services shall designate a total of \$15,000,000 for community mental health service providers.

Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations. Resolved: That the following appropriations and allocations are made.
