1 2	<b>Emergency preamble.</b> Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
- 3 4	<b>Whereas,</b> the spread of the novel coronavirus disease referred to as COVID-19 has created a public health emergency; and
5 6 7 8	Whereas, in response to this public health emergency, the Governor issued an executive order on March 18, 2020 requiring the closure of tasting rooms and requiring restaurants and bars, including those operated by Maine manufacturers of spirits, wine and malt liquor, to close their dine-in facilities; and
9 10 11 12	<b>Whereas,</b> although restaurants were permitted to reopen for dine-in service by June 17, 2020, they were required to limit indoor seating capacity and, from November 20, 2020 through January 2021, were additionally required to close their dine-in facilities by 9:00 p.m. nightly to prevent spread of the virus; and
13 14	Whereas, the reopening of bars and tasting rooms has been postponed until further notice; and
15 16 17	Whereas, the combined effects of the public health emergency and subsequent public health measures have significantly affected the economic health of Maine manufacturers of spirits, wine and malt liquor; and
18 19 20 21	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24	Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §707, sub-§7, as amended by PL 2019, c. 665, §9, is further amended to read:
25	7. Exceptions. This section does not prohibit:
26 27	A. A manufacturer or out-of-state wholesaler from extending the usual and customary credit to a wholesale licensee for the purchase of malt liquor or wine; $\Theta$

8 This bill clarifies that licensed Maine manufacturers of spirits, wine, malt liquor and 9 low-alcohol spirits products may sell and ship their products to a person located in another 10 state, as long as the sale and shipment are both authorized by and conducted in accordance 11 with the requirements of the law of the state where the shipment is delivered.
