COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 232, L.D. 328, "An Act To Fully Fund and Restore State-Municipal Revenue Sharing"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 1 the following:

Sec. 2. Transfer. Within 30 days after the effective date of this Act, the State Controller shall transfer to the Local Government Fund the amount of revenue required retroactively under this Act.'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment requires the State Controller to transfer to the Local Government Fund for state-municipal revenue sharing the amount required retroactively under the bill within 30 days after the effective date of this legislation.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill increases the revenue sharing percentage from 3.75% to 5% for the last six months of fiscal year 2020-21 and would result in a reduction in General Fund revenue of \$22,262,235 with a corresponding increase in Local Government Fund revenue.
