COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 235, L.D. 331, "An Act To Protect Student Privacy"

Amend the bill in section 3 in paragraph W in the last line (page 1, line 25 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "paragraph E" the following: 'except that law enforcement authorities and custodial parents and guardians may access those video and audio recordings'

Amend the bill in section 4 in paragraph X in the last line (page 1, line 29 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "heard" the following: 'except that law enforcement authorities and custodial parents and guardians may access video and audio recordings of the lessons or classes'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment is the minority report. It clarifies that law enforcement authorities as well as custodial parents and guardians continue to have access to the video and audio recordings made by security and surveillance cameras on school grounds, as well as the video and audio recordings of lessons and classes, even though they are not public records.
