#### §963. Review

The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters shall review the provisions and effects of this chapter no later than June 30, 2022 March 30, 2032 and at least once every 10 years after June 30, 2022 thereafter. The committee may report out legislation during the session of the Legislature in which a review under this section is completed.'

#### SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill, which is a concept draft, and changes the title. It updates the scheduling guideline dates in the State Government Evaluation Act. It updates the description of 4 joint standing committees. It moves review of the bureau or division within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services that administers and enforces the Maine Medical Use of Marijuana Act from the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over medical use of marijuana matters. It moves review of the Maine State Housing Authority from the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters. It requires the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over housing matters.
